Pearl reported she had read a newspaper article whereby the New Jersey Department of Health is considering a rule change that would legalize home baking. New Jersey is the only state in the nation that bans the sale of homemade foods for profit out of concerns for health and sanitation. Current New Jersey law requires bakers be licensed, which requires access to a commercial-grade kitchen.
