-RESOLUTION-Phase III Removal of excess street lights,

At the October 18, 2016 meeting Mr. Vogel was asked to meet with representatives of JCP&L to clarify the Township's responsibility for decommissioned streetlights where the arm apparatus will not be removed

Mr. Scheibener moved and Mr. Vogel seconded the motion to adopt the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION

Authorizing the Implementation of Phase Three of the Street Light Reduction Program

WHEREAS, the Township of Holland has performed an analysis of the cost to maintain street lights; and

WHEREAS, the analysis determined that the cost of providing streetlights in Holland was substantially more than the cost incurred in a neighboring Township that is about the same size and contains about the same population; and

WHEREAS, the analysis determined the Township could save substantial sums of money, thereby decreasing the tax burden, by eliminating streetlights where there would not be a risk to drivers operating in accordance with regulated speed limits and in a proper manner; and

WHEREAS, based on the recommendations of the Township Police Department and the Municipal Engineer, the Township devised a three part plan to reduce unnecessary streetlights; and

WHEREAS, the Township has fulfilled the first two parts of its plan by removing 51 streetlights in phase one and 93 streetlights in phase two, for a total of 144 unnecessary streetlights out of a total of 416 streetlights; and

WHEREAS, the police have not reported any increase in motor vehicle accidents or other issues where the lights have been removed; and

WHEREAS, JCP&L has agreed to remove the phase one and two streetlight fixtures at no cost to the Township, including the underground light posts located within the Brinkerhoff, Gridley Circle and Shady Mill Road developments; and

WHEREAS, JCP&L has reported that, according to their 2016 Municipal Lighting Handbook, the further removal of existing streetlights at no cost will only involve the removal of the photoelectric cell to prevent the light from operating, while any request for the physical removal of any streetlight fixture would result in billing charges for the associated labor; and

WHEREAS, as part of the phase three analysis performed by the Township, it was determined that 148 additional streetlights throughout the Township could be removed, by eliminating the photoelectric cell to prevent the light from operating, without creating an undue safety risk; and

WHEREAS, no additional underground light post streetlights will be removed in phase three given that the cost to remove underground light posts would negate any potential savings; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Engineer has advised the Township that there are no DOT regulations or engineering standards that require the installation or continued maintenance of existing streetlights; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee have concluded, after considering the facts as detailed herein, that removal of the streetlights in phase three will not create an undue safety risk, but will save the Township substantial money.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Holland, County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey that they authorize implementation of the phase three removal of 148 streetlights located throughout the Township and such actions as are necessary to accomplish the removal of those lights.
