-ORDINANCE 2021-13-Public Hearing/Final Adoption- Adding Deputy Tax Collector and reducing the minimum for Tax Collector

ORDINANCE 2021-13 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE 2020-2 TO DETERMINE AND FIX THE SALARIES AND WAGES OF CERTAIN OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HOLLAND, IN THE COUNTY OF HUNTERDON AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Holland, in the County of Hunterdon and State of New Jersey that Ordinance 2020-2 be amended to include the position of Deputy Tax Collector and change the Minimum of the Tax Collector as follows:

| OFFICE OR TITLE | MINIMUM | MAX |

| Tax Collector | 1,000.00 | 50,000.00 |

Amounts stated above as payable per year shall be considered salaries, or ranges of salaries, and shall be payable for the calendar year. However, where a range of salary or wage is specified or a collective bargaining agreement is specified, the exact salary or wage, within that range, shall be such exact annualized salary, or hourly wage, as is specified for the employee or position in a resolution from time to time adopted by the Township Committee or as defined in the collective bargaining agreement, during the time this Ordinance is effective.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all other sections of Ordinance 2020-2 not amended hereby shall remain in effect, and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by said Township Committee that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately after final adoption and publication in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

-RESOLUTION-Bellis III- Accepting a Refund Check and Approval of a Final Change Order RESOLUTION Accepting a Refund Check and Approval of a Final Change Order Capital Paving and Contracting LLC Bellis Road Phase III Improvement Project Township of Holland, Hunterdon County, New Jersey

WHEREAS. Capital Paving and Contracting LLC ("Capital") was awarded a contract by the Township of Holland to improve a portion of Bellis Road in October 2020 in the amount of \$203,903.66; and

WHEREAS, Capital performed the work in the fall of 2020 in accordance with the contract; and

WHEREAS, Capital addressed miscellaneous punch-list work items in the spring of 2021 to address comments put forth by the Township Engineer; and

WHEREAS, all work has been completed to the satisfaction of the Township and a close out of the project is sought by all parties at this time; and

WHEREAS, a partial payment in the amount of \$213,595.24 was authorized by the Township Committee in January 2021 at the recommendation of C. Richard Roseberry of Colliers Engineering and Design; and

WHEREAS, the final adjusted contract amount of the project is \$207,523.94; and

WHEREAS, the final adjusted contract amount is less than the amount of the first partial payment due to an **air void penalty** that was determined subsequent to the issuance of the first partial payment; and

WHEREAS, the Township is due a reimbursement from Capital due to the air void penalty in the amount of \$6,071.30; and

WHEREAS, Capital has furnished a check to the Township in the amount of \$6,071.30, dated June 30, 2021, to reimburse the Township as part of the close out; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Holland accepts the refund check from Capital in the amount of \$6,071.30 to allow for a close out of the contract with Capital; and

WHEREAS, a change order must also be processed by the Township as part of the close out of the contract with Capital to reflect final as-built quantities and the final adjusted contract amount on the project; and

WHEREAS, the Township Engineer has prepared a final change order to reflect the final as-built quantities and the final adjusted contract amount; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Holland, County of Hunterdon in the State of New Jersey, that the final change order, which increased the contract award amount from \$203,903.66 to \$207,523.94 for the Bellis Road Phase 3 Improvement Project is hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor is authorized to execute copies of the final change order once the Township Attorney approves the maintenance bond that was furnished by Capital for the project.

ORDINANCE 2020-15

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF CERTAIN INTERESTS IN REAL PROPERTIES BY NEGOTIATION, PURCHASE

WHEREAS, there are two properties in Holland Township that have conditions which require the Township to acquire certain easements;

WHEREAS, during severe rain events, the current system is unable to handle the volume of water; and

WHEREAS, the inability to handle such high levels of flow jeopardizes the health and welfare of the residents of the Township; and

WHEREAS, upon advice of the Township Engineer, the governing body of the Township has determined that installation of additional storm water piping would transfer the water to a different location by a gravity line improving public safety; and

WHEREAS, such gravity line must be constructed across certain residential properties designated on the Tax Map of the Township of Holland at Block 8.04, Lot 1; and Block 8.04, Lot 8; and

WHEREAS, the Township, therefore, requires temporary construction easements on the abovereferenced properties for the purpose of access and construction of an extension of the storm sewer to benefit the Township and permanent storm sewer easements on the above-referenced properties for the purpose of maintaining, repairing and replacing storm sewer structures, which are more particularly described on Schedule A and B attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the Township has attempted in good faith to negotiate the purchase of temporary construction easements for the purpose of access and construction of an extension of the sanitary sewer to benefit the Township and permanent storm sewer easements on the above-referenced properties for the purpose of maintaining, repairing and replacing storm sewer structures; and

WHEREAS, the Township has come to an agreement with the owners of Block 8.04, Lot 1; and Block 8.04, Lot 8; to purchase the easements for \$1.00; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Committee of the Township further find that a public use and purpose would be served for the benefit of the Township by acquiring certain property interests in the aforesaid properties.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Holland, the County of Hunterdon, as follows:

SECTION 1. The above recitals are incorporated into this section of the Ordinance as if specifically set forth at length herein.

SECTION 2. The Mayor and Committee of the Township of Holland, if advisable, specially authorize any and all necessary and appropriate actions by Township officials including the Mayor, Township Clerk, Township Engineer, Township Attorney, in conjunction with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and/or any other appropriate State or Federal entity, for obtaining of certain property interests in the properties as set forth herein through negotiation, purchase, including, but not limited to, the hiring of any experts, engaging the services of land surveyors, title insurance companies, appraisers, and any other professional whose services are necessary or appropriate to implement the purposes of this Ordinance, the making of any offer by the Township to the property owner(s) in the amount of \$1.00 interest that the Township seeks to acquire in said property, and to negotiate in good faith with the record owner(s) of the property for its voluntary acquisition of the property interest are unsuccessful for any reason to commence a condemnation action by the filing of a Verified Complaint and Declaration of Taking, depositing the estimated just compensation with the Clerk of the Superior Court, filing a Lis Pendens, and taking any and all other actions of any administrative or other nature necessary to complete the process contemplated by this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. The portions of properties for which a taking of property interests is authorized by negotiation, purchase pursuant to this Ordinance are located in the Township and listed on the Township tax map, the legal descriptions of which are attached as Schedule A to this Ordinance and specifically incorporated into this Ordinance by reference. The property interests to be acquired are temporary construction easements and irrevocable, perpetual, permanent easements in the properties identified herein.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> All appropriate officials of the Township, including, but not limited, to the Mayor, Township Clerk, Township Engineer, Township Attorney, and any and all experts or others acting on behalf of the Township are authorized by this Ordinance to sign any and all documentation and take any and all action necessary to effectuate the purposes and intention of this Ordinance.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> All appropriate officials of the Township, including, but not limited to, the Mayor, Township Clerk, Township Engineer, Township Attorney, are authorized by this Ordinance to sign any and all documentation to effectuate the purchase of the property interests by the Township.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed as to such inconsistencies.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

<u>SECTION 8.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

-ORDINANCE 2021-16 Introduction/First Reading-Appropriations for various building and land improvements

ORDINANCE 2021-16

AN ORDINANCE THAT APPROPRIATED \$200,000.00 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND, FOR VARIOUS BUILDING & LAND IMPROVEMENTS INCLUDING A NEW ROOF FOR THE DPW/LIBRARY BUILDING IN THE TOWNSHIP OF HOLLAND, COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY IN THE AMOUNT OF \$200,000.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, **BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Holland, in the County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- **SECTION ONE:** The sum of \$200,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund for Various Buildings & Land Improvements including a new roof for the DPW/Library building in the amount of \$200,000.00.
- **SECTION TWO:** The period of usefulness of the Building Improvements as defined by <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:2-22, is at least 5 years.

SECTION THREE: The capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey is on file with the Township Clerk and is available for public inspection.

SECTION FOUR:

The gross debt of the Township of Holland, as defined by <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:2-43 will not be increased by this ordinance.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance shall take effect 10 days after publication, following final adoption, as provided by law.
